COVID-19—An Update

This week has been a very busy time and we have tried to keep families and friends of Petergate updated with the current situation.

For the first time, we have had positive cases in our school community. As a result, we followed the necessary procedures and guidance given to us by Public Health England.

The national helpline, helped us to identify the next steps and we then sent out letters via Parent Mail that you will have received.

There are essentially 2 letters. One for those who have been in 'close contact' and one more general letter sent to everyone else. For us in school, 'close contact' means a 'bubble' will have to isolate after contact with a positive case. As a result of this, we have 3 classes self-isolating this week but also 8 members of staff, who worked with these classes and are now working from home. Please note your child must remain at home during the self isolating period. We also have a small number of staff across the school who are required to self-isolate as requested by Track and Trace.

Although this has provided some challenges for us, we have coped and the school has remained open for everyone else. We would like to thank you all for your swift responses and for your support for us as a school so that we can continue to keep everyone in our community safe. Your positive comments are very much appreciated!

Lockdown II—As you will no doubt be aware, England has gone back into national lockdown. It is clear that schools will remain open during this period so not too much will change for us. However, it is a good time to remind ourselves that we all must remain as vigilant as possible. As you know, households are now not allowed to mix with other households, even outside (please remember Early Years children cannot go out at all during the current self isolation period). The biggest risk in spreading the virus is through adult to adult contact so please make sure that we keep our distance at all times in school. If you are on the school site, please make sure you wear a face mask (unless exempt for medical reasons) and also avoid getting near anyone else. Although the new national restrictions do not apply directly to us, we must try to reflect the national situation and limit the spread of the virus. Please also avoid speaking to staff at the classroom door.

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Remote Learning—We have now started our full remote learning plan (which can be found on our school website) and, so far, it has gone quite smoothly. Obviously we are still learning ourselves and will try to make it as effective as possible, at the same time as making it manageable for teachers. This week, as Early Years children are at home, families have access to a selection of home learning activities on our website. From Monday, a Parent Mail will be sent to Early Years families with home learning set up by our teachers. You can then communicate with the teachers about learning taking place at home.

Staffing—As all our staff are working in bubbles and are unable to cross bubbles, if we start to get limited amounts of staff available we may need to close classes early and put a cap on numbers in the after school club. We will of course keep you informed if things change. Thank you for your understanding.

Science of Petersgote

Science at Petersgate is full of explorations, discovery and investigating the world around us, starting with the things and events that surround us in everyday life!

In Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2) we learn about:

- Materials, their properties and why we choose certain materials to do jobs
- Pushes, pulls and their effects
- How animals survive
- * Animal life cycles
- Habitats and how the seasons affect them
- How do plants grow?
- Making new plants

In Early Years our Science strand is covered within 'Understanding the World':

- Noticing similarities & differences in materials and living things
- Discovering the features of our immediate environment
- Observations of animals, plants and why changes occur

We are very lucky at Petersgate because we have such great school grounds with different habitats - the field, woodlands, hedgerows, a pond and the school garden.

This outside environment is the perfect place for us to carry out our **Longitudinal Studies**. These enable children to observe seasonal changes in different habitats for a whole year!




EYFS; We are watching the changes that happen in the Hawthorn bushes and noticing the changes in the weather too!

We will reopen as soon as we are told it is safe to do so.


If you have placed an order instore you will not be able to collect from the store after 5th November so we will now post your order out to your home address.
