

Early Years Adventurous Vocabulary

In order to develop deep understanding of words, children need to see, hear, and use new vocabulary in different ways. Getting children to think of 'Adventurous' words, notice 'Adventurous' words in their reading or in speech, as well as using 'Adventurous' words in their writing, are ways to deepen understanding. One way to support and develop writing is by having students consider how to incorporate 'Adventurous' words into their written work. For example pointing out how using a more powerful word than 'said', in their writing means the reader gets a greater understanding of a character or situation. Using 'Adventurous' words children can build a better picture in the mind of the reader, grabbing their attention and making them want to read on. 'Adventurous' words are bold and exciting language that children can use in their speech and writing. Focusing on building a store of 'Adventurous' words can deepen children's understanding of language as well as develop their written work as they progress through school.
