As the British weather can be so unpredictable, could you please ensure your child has a named lightweight coat/jacket in school, even if the weather looks like it is going to be a fine day—thank you



Music at Petersgate

In **Early Years**, the children have been enjoying exploring a range of instruments. We have been practising saying and remembering the names of the instruments and playing them in different ways for example: playing loud and quiet; playing fast and slow; and making scraping and tapping sounds. We retold the story of the Gingerbread Man and selected instruments to create sound effects to accompany the

story. We practise our good listening and copying using the instruments in listening and concentration games. During Chil we enjoy exploring the instruments too and applying the





characteristic sound of each instrument that lets you distinguish one instrument from another and texture is the overall sound created by multiple instruments or different musical voices. The children have been learning to identify families of school percussion instruments and to explore and use an increased range of sounds, beginning to use correct percussion techniques. They did this through accompanying the stories, 'Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen and 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' by Ronda and David Armitage, creating different sound effects for things such as the squelchy mud and the sea.

In **Year 2**, it has been Seahorse class' turn to learn to play ukulele through their 'Listen to Me' music sessions delivered by Hampshire Music Service's Mr Hoskins. It will be their final session this week and all the children (and adults) in Year 2 have learnt many new skills and made some great progress!

Next, it will be Year 1's turn for their 'Listen to Me' African Drums taster sessions with each class taking part in three sessions each. These will begin next week in Manta Ray class.
