Physical Education



Early Years

This half term Early Years children have been focusing on:

- experimenting with different ways of moving,
- jumping off an object and landing appropriately and,
- travelling with confidence and skill around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment.

Cricket Day

A few weeks ago all KS1 children took part in a cricket taster session run by Hampshire Cricket All Stars. All of the children thoroughly enjoyed their session where they had the opportunity to have a go at using a cricket bat to play an adapted version of cricket. Hampshire Cricket All Stars will be running an 8 week summer camp for all children aged 5-8. A flyer was sent home last week to years 1 & 2.



<u>Year 1</u>

In Year 1 this term the children have been focusing on running and jumping. They began by developing their ability to change direction, change speed and travel successfully along different pathways. In the most recent weeks they have been developing their jumping skills, jumping for height and distance.

<u>Year 2</u>

In Year 2 the children have been developing their sending and receiving skills. Focusing on mastering the correct throwing technique, ensuring their stance is spot on! The children have been increasing the accuracy of their throws through playing target based games.

Year 2

After the half term, in preparation for transition onto Junior school you may like your child to walk **independently** into school from the bottom of the approach road on their own. We ask that parents/guardians escort children to where the road crossing patrol usually stands and let them walk up to the school gates. Mrs Cook will be standing at the top of the pathway watching the children walk into their classrooms. (You will not be able to stand at the bottom to watch your child walk up the path, due to the congestion this may cause.)

We ask that you discuss with your child that they walk sensibly and do not run up the pathway into school.

Alternatively, you may like to say goodbye to your child at the gate and allow them to walk the last few metres on their own.

This arrangement is optional for all our year two children only.

Makaton—Unique Language Programme

Makaton is a unique language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable people to communicate. It supports the development of essential communication skills such as attention and listening, comprehension, memory, recall and organisation of language and expression.

Being able to communicate is one of the most important skills we need in life. Almost everything we do involves communication; everyday tasks such as learning at school, asking for food and drink, sorting out problems, making friends and having fun. These all rely on our ability to communicate with each other.

With Makaton, signs are used, with speech, in spoken word order. This helps provide extra clues about what someone is saying. Using signs can help people who have no speech or whose speech is unclear.

For those who have experienced the frustration of being unable to communicate meaningfully or effectively, Makaton really can help.

By using Makaton, children and adults can take a more active part in life, because communication and language are the key to everything we do and learn.

After half term, Mrs Wright will be teaching all children and the staff team different Makaton signs so that we are able to communicate with those who are unable to use speech. Look out in our newsletter to discover the signs we have been learning so that you can practice at home with the whole family!

It is such a wonderful skill to learn and we look forward to finding out how you are all getting on!
