
BE EHLLISHIM

At Petersgate we follow the Living Difference III planning for our RE teaching. This is an agreed syllabus for religious education (RE) in Hampshire, Portsmouth, Southampton and the Isle of Wight.

Living Difference III offers an educative approach to religious education, emphasising a process of enquiry into concepts. Children and young people have the opportunity to respond from their own experience before being introduced to the way others appreciate things.

Cool Milk

EARLY YEARS—We has been paying for all Early Years children to have milk during their first year. When your child moves up to Year 1 in September the school will no longer pay for your child's milk and you will be required to pay.

If you would like your child to continue to receive milk then you will need to go to their **website** and set up payment.

If you do not wish to pay for your child to continue participating in the Cool Milk scheme from September, please let the ladies in the office know so they can remove your child from the milk list, otherwise Cool Milk will be expecting you to pay. Thank you.

YEAR 1—If your child no longer requires to have milk please let the ladies in the office know and they can remove them from the milk list. Thank you.

YEAR 2—Please remember to let Cool Milk know which school your child will be attending if you want them to continue to have milk at their new school.

End of Year Medication/Inhalers Collection

Medication

If we have prescribed medication in school for your child, please remember to collect this at the end of the school day on Friday 23rd July from the school office. You will need to sign a tracking form to receive the medication.

Early Years and Year 1 (only)—when you collect your child's medication you will be given a new 'Parental Agreement to Administer Medication' form. If you need to return your child's medication in the new term, please complete this and bring these into school on the first day back on Thursday 2nd September.

Inhalers/Epipens

If we have an inhaler/epipen in school for your child, please remember to collect this at the end of the school day on Friday 23rd July from your child's class teacher. You will need to sign a tracking form to receive the inhaler.

Early Years and Year 1 Inhalers (only)—when you collect your child's inhaler/epipen you will be given a new 'Parental Agreement to Administer Medication' form. If you need to return your child's inhaler/epipen in the new term, please complete this and bring these into school on the first day back on Thursday 2nd September.
