Area of development:

"Please bring back gardening and cooking"

Response:

As previously stated, the gardening and cooking remains a focus for the school as this is an area which is really important to me and I feel it is a really important life skill. Appointing someone to cover this role is being completed internally. This is not something we can do quickly as we are combining this with the role they already have in school. But please be assured, the staff are continuing to build cooking into their teaching as it forms part of the Design and Technology curriculum.

Area of development: Response:

"It would have been nice to have a longer appointment, especially as my child is on the SEN register"

As stated in my letter which went out prior to the consultation evenings, if you require a longer slot then you could book a double slot or a request a longer appointment, if needed.

Area of development: Response:

"It was a little noisy, at times, being in the hall"

The appointments are in the hall, as this allows time for you to peruse the books whilst you wait, then you are not trying to make it from one side of school to the other, if you have more than one child. Some areas of the

school have smaller spaces to wait too.

Area of development: Response:

"Communication has improved but a little too much, at times"

Since I have started, I have wanted to ensure that parents/families are fully informed of the events/goings on at Petersgate, but there is a fine line between the balance of too much/too little communication. We are developing a communication overview to try and strike that balance.



Ofsted Updates!

Following on from our recent Ofsted visit, I wanted to give you termly updates regarding our progress.

What I did want to clarify, which was a question from parent forum regarding the subjects which were taught in school and how these were separated.

Core subjects are reading and writing (English), maths and science. Reading, writing and maths are taught daily and science is taught weekly.

The other subjects are known as foundation subjects and these are; religious education (RE), history, geography, computing, music, physical education (PE), art, design and technology.

Since our Ofsted, we have looked at our foundation subject assessment arrangements. We will continue to further refine these next term, to ensure there are opportunities for overlearning of key knowledge and skills. This will also give an opportunity for children to apply these in a range of ways. By looking at the way we assess these subjects, will enable us to more forensic in our approach in assessing against these knowledge and skills.

In the spring term, we will be sending out a Microsoft form as a survey regarding reading at home. There has been some feedback regarding the E-Collins books we use at home and I want to gather wider feedback about this approach to reading at home. As a school, I want to look really carefully to what the barriers are for why some children are not reading at home, so we can ensure there are a range of opportunities to support the reading at home.

The systems around the SEND provision has been a key focus and SEND paperwork has been developed and shared with parents.

These contain long and short term targets for the children. We will continue to review these over the year.

The Role of the Governing Body

Governors are strategic leaders within schools and have a vital role to play in making sure every child gets the best possible education. A governing body have a strong focus on the 3 core strategic functions:

- ♦ Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- ♦ Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance of the staff
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

Over the next couple of newsletters, we will be introducing our governors to our parents and families.


