This week we are introducing Michelle Easton (Parent Co-opted Governor)

I am a parent co-opted governor, and the special education needs and disabilities (SEND) link for Petersgate. My son is currently in Y1 – he seems to know everyone!

I have worked in law enforcement for most of my working life. I've also spent some time working for Children's Services, in particular, for the fostering and adoption services for Hampshire County Council. I am passionate about child development, and I have a sound understanding about the impact of trauma and adverse childhood experiences. I truly believe that strong, positive adult role models and a nurturing environment can make all the difference in a child's development.

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I knew I wanted to be a school governor very early on, even before we applied for a place at Petersgate. I wanted to be involved in his education, help shape the strategic direction and vision of the school, and advocate for my son and his peers in the wider school community. They all deserve the very best.

I chose Petersgate as I loved the sense of community. It's a good school with lovely, warm teachers and a supportive nurturing learning environment. Obviously, I want him to achieve the best he can and have good academic outcomes, but ultimately, I want him to be happy; I want him to be kind and I want him to be a good friend. The SCARF values at Petersgate support this – and I see these qualities in my son every day!
