Safeguarding is crucial in every school. Our primary role is to not only educate the children but to keep them safe. As part of our fortnightly newsletter

moving forwards, we will share with you any key safeguarding updates. These may be updates which have been shared with all schools locally or nationally or particular for our school.

This week, I felt it was important to introduce the role of the Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs). We have three DSLs in our school—Mrs Mitchell, Mrs Muir and Mrs Robb. Our photos are up in the main entrance, around school and on display on our website. We can also be identified by our red DSL and DDSL lanyards.

Our role is to address and respond to any safeguarding concerns raised by the children, staff, families or local community. We may have to liaise with key local services such as Children's Services, Early Help Services, the police or key agencies. If you would like to speak to one of us, please don't hesitate in getting in touch.

Monthly Coffee Mornings

During the course of the year, we will be offering a parent drop-in Coffee Morning.

Key staff will be available during these times and each one will have a theme.

This will be an opportunity to ask questions, advice, strategies or approaches to support all aspects of teaching and learning.

These mornings are informal, may be practical but presented in a supportive and non-judgemental environment and are designed to offer further support to families in ways to support their child/children at home, with staff potentially signposting you to other resources and/or support.

Mrs Robb, Family Support Leader and Emotional Literacy Support Assistant will also be available for all the above coffee mornings.

Parent/Child Survey

Thank you to all parents who completed the parent survey in the summer term. Your feedback is very important to us and has helped to shape things moving forward. Thank you to all those who shared positive feedback regarding any key staff and this has been shared with the staff in question.

We had 46 responses of our survey.

All parents felt they agreed/strongly agreed that their child was happy and safe at school.

The vast majority of parents felt that their child made good progress, were taught well, were supported with their particular needs, the school helped to develop their child's skills in reading, writing and maths and that their child enjoyed the subjects they had been learning about.

The vast majority of parents felt that the school had a good standard of behaviour and the school dealt with friendship issues effectively.

The vast majority of parents felt the school was well-led and managed and that the school responded to any concerns raised.

In response to the survey and some of the comments shared, the school is working hard to address the amount of communication between school and home. We are also looking at the range of after-school clubs we offer. We will also continue to source ways to include the offer of physical books alongside the E-Collins books. Library books are now being sent home. But we will continue to look at other ways to fund this project. We will keep you updated of our progress.
